Look at the front cover of a book. Predict what will happen then write a story to match the front cover.

Find out the ages of people in your family. Use these ages to make and answer addition and subtraction calculations.

Create a Stone/Bronze/Iron age timeline.

Spelling/Phonics

Every Friday you will receive spellings to be learnt for a test on the following Friday. These spellings will be in line with the spelling rule we will be learning each week.

Draw and label a picture of the best thing you did in the Summer Holidays.

Complete by: 25.9.24 Topic Task (History)

What animals could be seen in the Stone Age? Research them and create a fact/poster/drawings of each..

Complete by: 2.10.24 Science Task

Draw and label your favourite meal. What food groups are the ingredients from?

Create a comic strip or diary of a typical day in the Stone Age. For example hunting, making tools.

Write a letter to a Stone Age child explaining how different life is today.

Complete by: 9.10.24 Art Task

Draw some examples of Stone Age cave art.

Number Facts

Practice your multiplication and division facts for the 3 and 4 X tables (up to 12 X 2).
e.g. $3 \times 2 = 6$
 $2 \times 3 = 6$
 $6 \div 2 = 3$
 $6 \div 3 = 2$
